What are the aims of the course?

Course aim: Law is a fascinating subject which will give you an opportunity to explore your own rights and duties in relation to others and to the state. This AS course is a qualification in its own right and the first stage towards the full A level.

What topics will I cover? You will learn about the English Legal System which includes: an Introduction to Law; Civil and Criminal Cases; Courts and Appeals; Legal Personnel; Funding and the Provision of Services. You will also learn about Sources of Law which includes: Acts of Parliament; Delegated Legislation; Judicial Precedent; Statutory Interpretation and European Law.

What will the sessions consist of?

You will be taught in a friendly environment that encourages participation in a range of learning activities. Homework is essential for the successful completion of the course.

How is the course assessed?

You will sit 2 examinations based on the 2 units you are studying. You will sit 1 exam in May 2012 and 1 in June 2012. The course follows the OCR H134 Syllabus. Successful completion of the AS will enable you to carry on to the full A Level.
