Who is the Course for?

Do I need any prior experience? No previous knowledge of the course is assumed or required.

Will I need an Interview? No

What could I do next? Successful Psychology GCSE students would be able to progress to Psychology A-Level.

What are the aims of the course?

Course aim: Psychology is the study of human behaviour and experience. The course is designed to give students a comprehensive and varied introduction to the subject of Psychology, covering a wide range of fascinating subjects including sex and gender, criminal behaviour, memory, aggression, personality and cognitive development. Students may work in a person-centred profession and want to gain greater insight into people and transferable skills. You may be simply curious about what makes people do what they do!

What topics will I cover? Memory, non-verbal communication, development of personality, stereotyping, prejudice and discrimination, research methods, learning, social influence, sex and gender, and aggression.

What will the sessions consist of?

Psychology GCSE is made up of two Units: Making Sense of Other People and Understanding Other People.

You will be taught in a friendly learning environment and will participate in a range of learning activities.

How is the course assessed?

Assessment is by a written paper for each Unit of the course. (50% each).

Both exams consist of: five compulsory questions. Questions 1 to 4 are topic-based questions carrying 15 marks each and question five is a research methods question carrying 20 marks.

How can I prepare for the course?

No preparation is necessary.
