Who is the Course for?

Do I need any prior experience? Nothing specific apart from an interest in the subject matter.

What could I do next? AS Biology/Access Human and Social Biology Level 3.

What are the aims of the course?

Course aim: This course gives a wide-ranging introduction into how body systems work, how to keep the body healthy and 21st Century Health. The course has been specifically designed for post-16 studies and is suitable for interest, supplementing any other course, or for those who want a grounding in this area as a science qualification. Human Health and Physiology GCSE is an opportunity to acquire a positive attitude to healthy living whilst developing an enjoyment of the study of human beings.

What topics will I cover? The course covers the relationship between man, other organisms, the organisation and maintenance of the individual, defence against disease, reproduction and genetics. It also looks at cancer and how we deal with these in 2011.

What will the sessions consist of?

Practical work will be integral to the course as well as note-taking and discussion. There will also be a range of weekly tasks to carry out at home.

What to bring on the first night? Please bring paper, pens, pencils, and a folder with 20 dividers.

How is the course assessed?

Assessment is by practical coursework and one 2 hour exam paper in June. This can be taken at Foundation tier, giving grade C to G, or Higher tier, giving grades A* to D. The exam counts for 75%, the rest is made up from the coursework assessment, 25%.
