Who is the Course for?

This new course for beginners is an introduction to the art of film photography. It is available to those with no prior experience. This form of photographic practice is slowly becoming a rare luxury in the image world, due to the rise in snap shot digital imaging.

What are the aims of the course?

This is a creative and practical course which aims to preserve the fine art of photographic imaging. With the practice of hand printing exclusive to the chemistry dark rooms, this unique opportunity allows the students to explore the original art of image making.

Have you ever experienced the consideration that comes with the framing of a film image and the hands-on excitement of creating a photograph from projected negative to physical print? Through learning the majestic qualities that come with chemistry and film, you can experience the true art of photography.

What will the sessions consist of?

Within the course you will spend some time learning the process of photographing with film – elements such as light metering, framing, shutter speed and different film types. These are all aspects which are often automatic with digital imaging. The course will take you back to the basics of producing a photographic image without digital aid. Throughout the course you will cover how to load, photograph and print from film. There will also be sessions which will introduce you to working with studio and natural light photography. Within this you will experiment with still life photography and portraiture.

How is the course assessed?

The course is un-assessed, and is purely for recreational purposes.

How can I prepare for the course?

Equip yourself with any 35mm film camera, preferably an SLR.
