## Who is the Course for?

**Do I need any prior experience?** You will need to have a good level of IT knowledge and have access to a digital imaging package (Photoshop Elements) away from the College.

**Will I need an Interview?** No

**What could I do next?** Digital Photography, Digital Photography Workshop, Photography Portfolio Workshops.

## What are the aims of the course?

**Course aim:** The course aims to give students an opportunity to develop skills to efficiently use Photoshop Elements to organise and manage their photographs as well as editing and retouching them to improve their appearance.

**What topics will I cover?** During the course through a series of open discussions, demonstrations and practical exercises, you will be introduced to : cropping, layers, masks, levels, printing, photographic image management, file naming regimes and image file types. By the end of the course students will be able to perform essential editing; cropping and adjusting colours of digital images while understanding the principles that underpin these processes.

## What will the sessions consist of?

You will be taught in a friendly learning environment.

**What to bring on the first night?** Pens, paper, USB memory stick, 10-15 JPG files.

## How is the course assessed?

There are no formal assessments or exams on this course, however, you will be encouraged to spend at least an hour between sessions to put into practice what you have learned.

## How can I prepare for the course?

Familiarise yourself with the software interface.
