Question: What are some of the key topics I would cover?

Question: Are there any subject specific entry requirements?

Yes, for level 3 you will need an average GCSE score of 4 or above including English and for level 2 you will need a average score of 3 and there will an opportunity for you to resit maths and English if needed.
