STUDENTS USE THE UCAS APPLY SITE TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FORM FOR UNIVERSITY. THIS APPLICATION FORM IS LINKED TO COLLYERS SO THAT WE CAN SEE THE APPLICATION AND ADD PREDICTED GRADES AND REFERENCES TO THE FORM BEFORE SENDING IT TO UCAS.

This will let you access all the 2022 application processes.



As part of the registration process you will be sent an email with a code to verify your account. Two point verification will most likely remain as a feature of signing in to your account from this point as a security measure so you may receive emails or texts from UCAS as you work through the process.

As each section opens it will have a set of questions asking for relevant information. The righthand menu records your progress and you can use this menu to navigate to other sections. Just remember to save any new information you add before you exit the section.

Some sections will ask you additional questions depending upon the answers you enter onto the form so always work from top to bottom of the form.

The tiles also show your progress in filling out the form so that you can check on your progress as you move through the process of application.

You can only apply once in a cycle. Please don't apply more than once in a cycle, as you can't receive a refund for further applications. If you've applied in previous cycles and want to apply again As we move into the applications time frame you will have tutorial sessions and workshops that address various sections of the form. Such as completing your personal statement. These presentations and instructions are also available on the Higher Education Sharepoint

Your Tutor and Head of House will check that you have filled out the sections correctly. Your Tutor will check through your personal statement and you can seek advice from Teachers and Library staff but ultimately you must embrace the responsibility of filling out the form personally. It is a choice about your future and you need to be comfortable that you have filled this out to the best of your ability and made the right choices for you.

My initial interest in medicine stemmed from my excitement of Human Biology. Each time I reflect upon the sheer complexity and seemingly impossible intricacy of the human body, I feel awestruck. It seems incomprehensible that during each cell division, a 30-book set of Encyclopaedia Brittanica's worth of information is copied. What's equally fascinating is how doctors are able to fix the complexities of the human body. This is why being part of this profession is my ambition. Furthermore, with the future ever advancing the quality of treatment, success within medicine should be even more common and rewarding. An example of this was during my time shadowing a consultant Haematologist, who revealed that he is now able to successfully treat more patients than ever before. Whilst I am aware that the profession sometimes has drawbacks, such as mortality, which is something I have encountered during my experience. I believe I have the resilience to deal with both of these

Spending work experience at my local hospital, I was fortunate enough to see many different departments, and it was mesmerising to witness the true depth of knowledge within medicine. Shadowing a consultant of Chemical Pathology, an already highly specialised sub-department, made me realise that the journey of a doctor was a life long process of self improvement. Being able to specialise in the future, and make a field of medicine my own is an exciting prospect, and even though I may be taking exams until my mid thirties, very few professions can be as consistently stimulating as medicine.

WORKING TO DEADLINES

Students, Tutors, Heads of House, Senior Management, the Director of **Progression and the** Oxbridge **Coordinator, and** UCAS processing team, will all be working to ensure that the process goes smoothly but it is wise for students to work to college deadlines to ensure forms are processed in a timely fashion.

STEPS INVOLVED IN PROCESSING A STUDENTS UCAS FORM

THIS PROCESS TAKES APPROXIMATELY TWO COLLEGE WEEKS TO COMPLETE IF THE STUDENT HANDS THE FORM IN ON DEADLINE AND CORRECTLY FILLED OUT. CORRECTIONS AND ALTERATIONS WILL ADD TO THIS TIME LINE

Deadlines for 2022 entry

<u>18 May 2021</u> UCAS Undergraduate Apply opens for 2022 entry.

<u>7 September 2021</u> Applicants can pay and send their applications to UCAS, and unis and colleges can start making decisions on applications.

<u>15 October 2021 (College deadline for completed forms 27th September)</u> Applications for Oxford, Cambridge and most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine/science should arrive at UCAS by 18:00 (UK time). The reference needs to be completed before the application can be sent to UCAS.

<u>15 January 2022 (College deadlines for completed forms 22nd October)</u> Applications for the majority of undergraduate courses should arrive at UCAS by 18:00 (UK time) on the equal consideration date (check course details in our search tool for the correct deadline). The reference needs to be completed before the application can be sent to UCAS.

<u>25 February 2022</u> Extra starts for eligible applicants.

<u>30 June 2022</u> If an application is sent to UCAS by 18:00 (UK time) on this day, they send it to the chosen universities or colleges. Applications received after this date will automatically be entered into Clearing.
