Who is this course for?

Access to HE Diplomas are perfect for people who don't have the traditional qualifications to study at university.

Our Access to HE Diploma is a part-time evening course where, over one year of study, you'll complete a qualification that's equivalent to three A Levels.

This course is ideal if you want to progress to a degree in a healthcare related subject.

Some of our students have recently left college; others are looking to change careers at a later stage in life; for others still, this is their first college experience.

There's no such thing as a typical Access student: our students are of all ages and come from all backgrounds.

Did you know...

Students on nursing and other healthcare degree courses can apply for a £5,000 grant per academic year? There's an additional £2,000 available for students with dependants under 15 years. This is non-repayable and is in addition to any student loans.

What are the entry requirements?

You must be aged 19+ on the 1st September in the year you join the course.

You should have GCSE English and Maths at Grade C/4.

Some universities accept students with Level 2 Functional Skills English and Maths. You can check what the entry requirements are for the degree course you're interested in on the universities' websites.

If you don't have already have Maths and English at Level 2, please contact us and we can discuss your options for achieving these qualifications with us.

Most degree courses require you to have relevant experience. You may already work in a healthcare setting. If you don't, you should look to gain some voluntary experience or work shadowing in an area relevant to your chosen career path. You'll need this when you apply to university in the autumn term of your Access course.

How will I be taught?

You'll be taught by our experienced and knowledgeable Access tutors over two evening sessions a week plus some Saturdays, term time only.

The majority of teaching will be classroom based. There will, however, be an element of blended learning so you'll use technology such as Microsoft Teams or Zoom. There may also be some online study units. You'll need access to a PC, laptop or other suitable device.


You will be assessed as you progress thought the course using a variety of methods, including coursework and exams.

What will I study?

Your course is 60 credits (45 graded) and includes the following modules:

- Biomolecules for Healthcare
- Cardiopulmonary System
- Cell Biology
- Digestion and the Liver for Healthcare
- Disease and Body Defence
- Energy for Healthcare
- Mammalian Control Systems
- The Musculoskeletal System
- Health and Health Services
- Understanding Ethics in Healthcare
- Understanding Health and Well-being
- Understanding Health Promotion and Health Education
- Introduction to Psychology
- Psychology of Health
- Research Methods in Psychology
- · Reviewing and Planning for the Future
- Mental Health and Self-care whilst Studying
- Skills for Study: Research

You'll also complete an Independent Academic Study on a topic that's relevant to your chosen career path.



What support is there?

We provide support for students with learning needs and those who require emotional support. This is usually in the form of individual study support sessions, following assessment.

All students will receive three individual tutorials when completing their Independent Academic Study.

We'll also support you with your university application during the autumn term of the course.

Students who are facing financial hardship can apply for help with travel costs and childcare costs whilst studying with us.

How much does the course cost?

The majority of our students use an Advanced Learner Loan to fund the course. These loans are not means tested and there are no credit checks. This loan will be written off when you complete your degree.

If you're 19-23 years and this is your first Level 3 qualification, then you're likely to receive full funding for this course.

The course fee is £3,300 for students who wish to self-fund.



You can complete an online application form for this course on our website. We'll review your application and invite you for an informal interview if you meet our entry requirements.

Once you've signed up, we'll invite you to join our induction event that takes place during the summer term preceding the course start. Here you'll get to meet your tutors, find out more about them and the course – and be set some summer homework to get you started.

Please note that a non-refundable deposit of £150 is required at the point of booking. Please talk to us if this would cause you financial hardship.
