Higher Education Award



- The HKF HE Award offers support to 2nd year students who are aiming to start a first-time programme of higher education in the autumn at a UK higher education institution and can demonstrate:
- they face severe financial hardship which will make their progression to higher education difficult
- they have overcome significant barriers to complete their further education

Each year the Foundation receives applications from many more students than they are able to support. You should only apply if you are facing severe financial hardship which will make your progression to higher education difficult.

Successful applicants of the award are offered:


- Financial support, usually in the form of a £2,250 bursary provided in instalments during your time in higher education
- A named contact at the Foundation
- Access to free training sessions geared towards improving the skills needed throughout university and employment


