Within the Faculty of Science, Psychology A level is delivered via 4 hours 20 minutes of lessons per week following the AQA specification. There are approximately 190 students in the year 1 cohort and 160 students in year 2. There are currently five teachers for Psychology in the department.

Members of the teaching staff are also personal tutors. Tutors monitor progress and offer support and guidance to some twenty-five students. The ability to contribute to our extensive enrichment programme would also be welcome.
