Apprenticeships - which levels are suitable for you?

- **Advanced Apprenticeship** = L3 – suitable for students who have L3 qualifications in subjects *unrelated* to the apprenticeship programme. *This is a sideways step but sometimes essential to get you onto the correct pathway.*
- **Higher Apprenticeship** = L4 & L5 - suitable for students who have L3 qualifications in subjects *related* to the apprenticeship programme. *Competition for these apprenticeships is strong!*
- **Degree Apprenticeship** = L6 & L7 – suitable for students who have 3 A Levels/BTECs/T Level at A* to C or D* to M. *Competition for these apprenticeships is intense – harder than getting into University degrees!*

Apprenticeships – when do you apply?

- **Annual recruitment cycle** – wave 1 launch begins in **October/November** and wave 2 launch is **February** to fit in with National Apprenticeship Week. *Be ready to start the application process in September of Year 2 – the Apprenticeship/Employment Pathway tasks will prepare you for early applications in the Autumn term of Year 2.*



- **Ongoing recruitment** – some employers are happy to receive applications at any time of year and will keep your information until they have a suitable position available. *The Apprenticeship/Employment Pathway tasks will prepare you for spontaneous applications as & when they are advertised.*

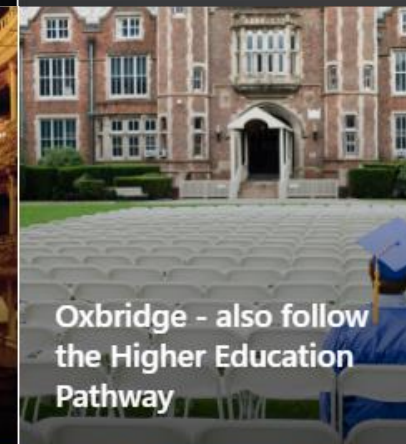
