WHY DO YOU NEED TO THINK ABC

A – **AIM HIGH – BE ASPIRATIONAL** – Aim for SOME courses that have higher entry requirements than your predicted grades - you may do better in your exams than predicted or universities may be flexible in their entry requirements after results day. Make this choice realistically - do not apply for courses requiring A* AA if you are predicted CCC.

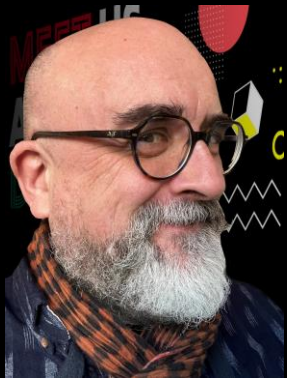
B – **BE REALISTIC – HAVE A BACK UP PLAN** – choose SOME courses with entry requirements that meet your predicted grades – if you meet these or slightly underperform you are most likely to be offered a place. Choosing all your courses much higher than your predicted grades can mean limited or no offers being made.

C – **CHANGE - HAVE A CLEARING PLAN** - On results day universities publish remaining open places on courses. If you have missed your entry requirements for your firm and insurance choices, you will be entered in to clearing and can choose from these often very well-regarded courses such as Russell Group. Universities are keen that courses are full – offering places that you would not be able to access at any other time. This is the point when your results are at their most powerful and you stand a greater chance of obtaining a higher entry course. For instance, you may have been predicted BBB and achieved BCC there may be a place on a course that originally asked for ABB – as you were predicted BBB they might consider offering you that place. You can take a Gap year and apply next year but you may then have a more limited choice as your results are known and offers you are made are directly related to that. Understanding what courses are available in or close to the subject you want to study and have **more** than your 5 choices lined up – have a list of acceptable clearing locations to hand.* **PLACES FILL UP VERY QUICKLY - YOU NEED TO BE PREPARED TO PHONE AROUND UNIVERSITIES AS SOON AS YOU REALISE YOU HAVE NO OFFERS TO LOCK IN YOUR PLACE.**
