### Progress Review 4:

A Level Courses	How performance grades are determined
<b>Current</b>	Current grade is the Transfer Exam Result - Grades A* - E required to progress to second year.
<b>Estimated</b> (Provisional UCAS Prediction)	Estimated Grade is informed by all relevant assessment evidence from the first year of the course, as well as studentship. Transfer Exam results, coursework and externally assessed units are likely to be weighted more heavily in determining the estimated grade. <b>NB: UCAS prediction may increase if student demonstrates significant improvement late summer/early autumn.</b>
Vocational Courses	How performance grades are determined
<b>Current</b>	Current grade is based on performance throughout the year. A U grade would indicate that a student needs to resit an element of their course in the second year (or is awaiting the outcome of a resit).
<b>Estimated</b> (Provisional UCAS Prediction)	Estimated Grade is informed by relevant assessment evidence from the first year of the course, as well as studentship. Students achieving D*-P will be allowed to continue, pending any unit exam results in August. A U grade would indicate that a student has failed a core unit and cannot continue with the course. <b>NB: UCAS prediction may increase if student demonstrates significant improvement late summer/early autumn.</b>

### Studentship Grades

Grades for PR4 are based on studentship for the period of study between PR3 and PR4.

### Failed Exams

#### A Level:

- Students who receive U Current Grade and E (or above) Estimated Grade, should take **Transfer Exam Resit** but select a Substitute Course as a back-up option should they fail the resit.
- Students who receive U Current Grade and U Estimated Grade, may choose to take the **Transfer Exam Resit** or could consider replacing the subject with a Substitute Course.
- If a student achieves a pass grade in a Transfer Exam Resit they will be enrolled onto the second year of the course but if they fail, they will be enrolled onto their chosen Substitute Course.
- Students who fail more than one subject will be referred to a senior member of staff to consider their options.

#### Vocational:

- Students who receive U Estimated Grade have failed a core unit and cannot continue with their course. Single BTEC students will need to replace the BTEC with a Substitute Course.
- Double BTEC students will be referred to a senior member of staff to consider their options.
- If changes are required due to failed summer exams, students will be contacted following release of results in August.

### 1A to 2A Progression Day – Tuesday 16 June

- 2A Enrolment appointments take place on Tuesday 16 June in Shelley Building. Students must check appointment details on MyProgress (under Times tab) w/b 8<sup>th</sup> June and refer any queries to their Tutor. Students must complete their MyProgress Plan before the meeting. Parents/carers may join 2A Enrolment meetings if this would be helpful.
- ALL students should expect to come into college for their appointment and will be required to attend a Progression Lecture. Your Tutor will let you know the location of your allocated lecture – please remember your ID as this will be used to register attendance.**

### Progression Lecture Timings

Each Tutor Group has been divided into 8 groups. The Progression Lecture will be repeated 6 times in 2 locations to accommodate all students. Please attend the Progression Lecture at the time and place allocated to your group – you will be registered on entry. You can work out your group number by checking your 2A Enrolment Appointment on MyProgress against the timings below:

## Met the requirements to progress to 2<sup>nd</sup> year in all your courses – WHAT NEXT?

Well done! During your 2A Enrolment appointment you will confirm your programme of study for next year and spend some time discussing progress, concerns, summer targets and future plans with your tutor or a teacher. If you have performed below target grade, you will need targets in your action plan to track progress moving forward. **If you have performed significantly below your target grades, it is likely that teachers will request a targeted parent's evening appointment (18 June).** There is time to improve your performance before the end of your courses, so reflect on feedback you've had through the year to help guide you. **If you wish to make any amendments to your programme of study for second year, for example, picking up an Enhancement Course, you will need to confirm this at your 2A Enrolment appointment.**

### I didn't pass all my subjects – WHAT NEXT?

**Don't panic!** Most students who do not achieve a pass grade in one of their courses, are able to progress into the second year. You may be offered the opportunity to take a Transfer Exam Resit and/or make an adjustment to your programme of study. Students must continue to attend timetabled lessons until Transfer decisions have been finalised.

Students who have less than 3 A Level equivalent courses to continue into second year (e.g. only 2 A Levels or 1 A Level and a Single BTEC or just a Double BTEC), are required to pick up an additional course to maintain full-time student status and to enhance their future progression opportunities. If you failed or dropped out of a course during your first year due to mitigating circumstances or were only taking two L3 courses plus a GCSE that you have now passed, you must pick up a substitute course to complete your programme.

Tutors and teachers will advise you on the most appropriate option to support your future aims during your 2A Enrolment appointment. To prepare for your meeting, research your options and think about what you hope to do beyond Collyer's, as this will help guide your discussion with your tutor.

Please note - only in very rare circumstances are we able to approve a reduced programme of less than 3 blocks. Heads of House, senior staff and the Careers Adviser will be available on Progression Day to provide specialist advice and to consider cases where mitigating circumstances apply. Please note, students are not usually permitted to repeat a course they have failed unless there are significant mitigating circumstances and sound educational reasons for doing so.
