Accounting	Back
This term in Accounting, we will be moving into some revision. So far this year we have covered some of the concepts required under the headings of Financial Accounting and Management Accounting. These will be tested in the upcoming Transfer Exam in May and so we will spend some time on revision and looking at past exam style questions.	
This term students may notice increased demands on their private study time as they prepare for the Transfer Exam. No doubt they will notice this across all their subjects and so will need to work out a balance with their time.	
Independent study this term: Learners should have been using the revision programme available on the Accounting SharePoint site. They should continue to do this. There are also a range of voice-over presentations on the site that they can use to remind themselves of any concepts.	
Pro-study this term: Will involve completing questions as practice for the upcoming Transfer Exam as well as directing learners to specific concepts to review.	
Next assessment(s): We will do some in-class tests in preparation for the Transfer exam. The transfer exam will be in May and will be a 2-hour exam that draws on everything we have covered this year.

Business Studies	Back
All Unit 1A content was completed by Easter. Between now and study leave, students will take part in revision-focused lessons to help them prepare as effectively as possible for the Transfer Exam. On their return after work experience in June, both their teachers will be delivering the first part of the Marketing unit. Following this, students will enjoy an exciting few weeks where they will have the opportunity to apply their business skills in practice, while also developing key competencies that employers have identified as areas for improvement — specifically, the use of Excel and presenting skills.

This term in BTEC Business the students have a public exam that counts towards their final grade. This is Unit 2 Developing a Marketing Campaign which is on Friday 8 th May. The students will receive a case study for the exam the day before (at 2pm on Thursday 7 th May) and they can annotate this as well as preparing two sides of notes that they can bring into the exam.	
This term students may notice that when they return from study leave they will have one teacher rather than two for the remainder of the term. The reason for this change is that in Year 2 students study one unit after another rather than two consecutively. The first unit that students will study is Unit 3 Personal and Business Finance.

This term in BTEC Business the students have a second public exam that counts towards their final grade. This is Unit 2 Developing a Marketing Campaign which is on Friday 8th May. Child Development and Care (L2)	Back
This term in Child Development we are focused on revision in preparation for the Exam Assessment (EA). We will be covering all Content Areas to recap and revise knowledge. Students will have received their marks for their NEA. A mock exam will take place, and the results will be combined to give a predicted grade.	
This term students may notice a focus on written answers to prepare students for this style of exam.	
Independent study this term: Students should be completing 4-hours of independent study a week, focused on revision for their exam. Each lesson will cover a Content Area and students are encouraged to use the online resources and textbook to further revise the content in their own time.	
Pro-study this term: Pro-study tasks are set to reinforce understanding from lessons. Exam style questions are set, and students are given a week to upload their answers.

Computer Science	Back
We are now covering the final elements of Component 1 of Computer Science, working on the trickier concepts of the theory of algorithms and programming. This includes writing and evaluating advanced algebraic expressions. Students will be looking the worst-case scenarios for algorithms and calculating their efficiency regarding time and space.	
This term students may notice: A greater focus will be on exam practice questions and thinking about exam technique, to get the best possible outcome from the transfer exams. Students will be working on their transfer project; this contributes 20% of their transfer grade to match the final assessment of the qualification.	
Independent study this term: students will be completing a series of exam questions each week. These are set each Monday on Teams and are due to be uploaded by midnight on Friday, this is a hard deadline with the assignment becoming unavailable after this time so please make sure it is uploaded on time. The following week students will be given the mark scheme to self-assess their work and annotate any areas of improvement. This should then be uploaded with the new piece of work by midnight on Friday. The remaining 2 hours should be spent on the termly programming tasks set in class.	
Pro-study this term:	

Students will be developing their programming skills by working through self study programs on Test and Track an external resource that we have paid for. They can choose from the following: • Advanced python • Machine learning Python on the Web or create one of the projects. Students can work on independent projects if they clear it with Helen to ensure it is of sufficient quality.	
Next assessment(s): Transfer exams will take place this term, assessing the students understanding of the whole year. The computer Science exam is on Thursday 18th May and will be a 2hr 45 min exam paper.	
Further links:	Other reminders: Transfer project is due to be completed and submitted in students SharePoint folders 11/05. This is a big project and takes a lot of time and effort from students.

Criminology	Back
This term in Criminology we will be focusing on Unit 2- Criminological Theories before moving on to Unit 3- Crime Scene to the Courtroom. We will be revising all previous content from both Unit 1 and Unit 2 focusing on the impact of campaigns and social change on Policies and Laws. Students will be able to apply not only their previous learning, but also current affairs into the Social Construction of Crime in Society. The final few weeks of this term will be used to introduce all first years to the new Unit- Crime scene to the courtroom, another Controlled assessment Unit (8 hour assessment split over 2 days).	
This term students may notice the applied purpose of the course demands learning related to authentic case studies and a heavy focus on theories of Criminality and applying them to real life scenarios. It also requires learners to consider how the use and application of their learning impacts on themselves, other individuals, employers, society and the environment. Students will be working through each assessment criteria at a fast pace (weekly) to ensure they are fully organised and prepared for the Unit 2 (90 minute) exam in May. This is worth 25% of their overall qualification. Students should already be familiar with a more independent way of working and exploring a range of real-life case studies/ everyday situations on crime. Students will be expected to attend subject workshops and communicate regularly with teachers if they are unsure of any of the content we will be covering in class. Organisation of class notes, workbook and case studies in a folder will be key to success for revision and lots of exam practice.	
Independent study this term: Students will complete a weekly pro study task set at 9am on the Monday morning and due in the following Monday at 9am. This will consist of the unit 2 assigned workbook pages to complement their studies in class. There may also be some additional activities set by subject teachers including past paper questions and key assessment. From February half term students will also be expected to complete a weekly revision activity which will be set to enhance their revision. Students will be preparing for their formal unit 2 exam in May 2026. Students will also be encouraged to complete regular exam practice outside of lessons. Pro-study this term: Will continue to be set on teams each week. Please make sure you check the weekly pro study schedule on our subject SharePoint site and make sure you know when key assessments are scheduled.

Digital Production	Back
This term in Digital marks a critical stage in our development journey. With major assessments fast approaching, students will be heavily engaged in revision, skills refinement, and exam preparation.	
This term students may notice Students will notice a shift in pace this term. Lessons are now focused entirely on revision, exam techniques, and fine-tuning their knowledge and skills in preparation for their final assessments. We are continuing to build the vital programming and project management skills needed for both their exams and future placements. Students will also revisit previous project work, including improvements to their Bean & Brew project and developing prototypes as part of their occupational specialism tasks.	
Independent study this term: Students are expected to focus on: • Thorough revision of Core Content 1 and 2. • Completion of past papers to practise exam technique. • Reviewing feedback from mock exams to refine weak areas. • Preparing for the Employer Set Project (ESP) tasks. A consistent revision schedule will be the difference between an average grade and an excellent one. Independent commitment at home is critical.	
Pro-study this term: Pro-Study will be concentrated on: • Revision sessions for Core and ESP subjects. • Targeted preparation for the Core Papers and ESP final tasks. • Skills development linked to programming, prototyping, and evaluation. Students should engage fully with the Pro-Study materials and use them to extend their knowledge beyond the classroom.

Education & Early Years	Back
This term in Education and Early years marks the beginning of the exam season. Students have completed the taught content for Year 1 and are now focusing on revision and exam preparation.	
This term students may notice a shift of focus from learning taught content to applying their knowledge to meet the exam requirements. Lessons will focus on exam preparation with each teacher revisiting previously taught content to recap and refine students' knowledge. Students will continue developing their industry placement skills and will carry out Assessment 3 and 4 at the end of the term. Students are likely to feel the weight of exams, and it is therefore important students keep on top of their workload and revision.	
Independent study this term: Students are expected to focus on revision for their Core Paper and Employer Set Project (ESP). Students must follow the revision schedule which started during February half term. Students can access a range of revision resources and past paper questions on the Education and Early Years T Level SharePoint site.	
Pro-study this term: Students are expected to continue attending placement on a weekly basis. Students must plan and lead Assessment 3 and 4 by the end of this term. Students must be planning their Standalone Professional Discussions (SPD) and arranging a time to complete these in college or in placement.

Film Studies	Back
This term in Film Studies is a critical time for consolidation and practice of all learning so far. Students will focus primarily on revision and essay practice and technique, in preparation for the upcoming transfer exam followed by the beginning of the non-examined-assessment component (NEA) that will shift focus towards short films, screenwriting and basic filmmaking techniques.	

This term students may notice a greater emphasis on independent learning and a move towards practical filmmaking skills away from essay-based assessment.	
Independent study this term: Revision of all content studied so far including Global Film, Old and New Hollywood, and Spectatorship and Ideology.	
Pro-study this term: Will be less structured with less prescribed reading and quizzes. Students are encouraged to revisit pro-study tasks where needed to aid revision via links available on the subject SharePoint page.
